On the sun-soaked island of Santorini, Greece, the main city of Thira sits above the jagged, towering cliffs, which are remnants of a volcanic caldera. At its highest point, the cable car ascends to 220 meters above the gleaming blue water and unique volcanic rock faces below. My dad and I chose the cable car. As someone who absolutely loves heights, I can attest to the fact that the view of the striking seascape below was truly fabulous.

The entire day seemed as if we were driving our rental car within the confines of a movie set. The island landscapes were spectacular, offering photogenic panoramas in every direction. The highlights of the day were soaking in the warm waters of the Aegean Sea at Perissa Beach and enjoying Greek pastries at a small bakery we stumbled upon on our drive back into town. As we rode the cable car back down to sea level, I reflected on how this was an experience we would always remember, for it was one of those priceless days, which only God could coordinate.

Much like this picturesque isle offers a choice of transportation to travel to the main island's central hub; there are many other choices in life. When we sit down at a restaurant, we commonly receive a menu. We can choose anything we like, ranging from our favorite appetizer and entrée to our choice dessert and beverage. In many countries, individuals have the freedom to choose which church to attend, which school to send their children to, and which home to live in. From the style of clothing we want to wear to the make and model of car we prefer to drive, the choices we have are seemingly endless. An infinite number of choices, yet only one choice on this earth will make a difference for all eternity. The decision to accept Jesus Christ

as your personal Lord and Savior is the most important decision you will ever make. The only way to receive salvation is through Jesus Christ alone. Jesus said, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6). You cannot buy salvation, nor can you earn it through kindheartedness or charitable acts. Having lost all three of my siblings as premature infants, my precious mom, as well as three grandparents and numerous friends and relatives, I have attended more funerals than weddings. Yet even in the midst of these heartbreaking experiences, I knew my help would come from the Lord, as God's Word promises in Psalm 121:2. Jesus said, "Surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age" (Matt. 28:20). Jesus will never fail us, even when life is uncertain.

Beyond the confines of this earth and all of life's disappointments, God is preparing an eternal home for us in Heaven. The sorrow we have endured will fade away. The tears we have cried will be no more. The moment Jesus steps out on the clouds, the world will change eternally. God's Word says, "For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever. Therefore encourage one another with these words" (1 Thess. 4:16–18). The coming of Christ is closer than it has ever been before. You must answer honestly, for God knows your heart. The time to answer is now, while you can still choose eternal life through Jesus Christ.

God loved the world so much that He gave His only Son to die on a cross for the forgiveness of our sins (John 3:16). Because of love, He paved the way for us to receive redemption: "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Rom. 5:8).
